The remaining 120 hours must be in the transdisciplinary foundations as follows:

60 hours in Understanding Addiction/Treatment Knowledge (UA/TK); AND 60 hours in Application to Practice/ Professional Readiness (AP/PR). Within these 80 hours must be at least 4 hours of HIV and 2 hours of domestic violence education/training.
